Athletic Director Report

Scott Swanson spswanson@madison.k 12.wi.us Great to have a functioning building again! Fully staffed with coaches for all sports.

Shared slideshow that is currently playing the building with upcoming sporting events. You can also always find athletics calendar and information at <u>lafolletteatheltics.com</u>.

We're in the second year of digital <u>Go Fan</u> for sporting event passes and individual tickets. You can purchase in advance or at games, but note cash is not accepted either way. Students should still purchase their athletic passes through Infinite Campus.

Last year, 56 student athletes had a 4.0 GPA — 13% of all students. 236 had a 3.5 or higher GPA. That's 45% of our students. Over 65% had a 3.0 GPA or higher. Athletics is making a

positive difference in academics too.

There are 415 student athletes playing a sport this fall (out of total enrollment of just under 1,500)

Doing Lancer alumni athlete profiles of student athletes on the school building slideshow this year. At least 30 alums playing college sports. Not our goal with our athletes to ensure they play college sports, but it's fun to share. Concessions

Expanded to offer girls and boys volleyball and boys soccer concessions in addition to football this fall. Always need parent help and students can also volunteer as runners. See our <u>Volunteer page</u> to sign up.

Last year was the first year hosting concessions for a Basketball Development League tournament for younger players. This year, we're hoping to host 2 or 3 BDL tournaments (boys and girls).

Concessions are *the single biggest source* of fundraising for the Boosters for all of the money we use to meet funding requests for sports, academics, the arts, scholarships, staff requests and more.

Family Fun Day

Was held on Saturday, Aug. 17 in coordination with the No Fear All Fun 5K Run/Walk. Attendance was okay; not sure if we'll do it again next year or modify it in some way.

Freshman Night

Helped with this in August. Boosters provided free (limited) concessions. It was very well attended.

Upcoming events

Funding requests

- Principal Thompson annual Booster budget request for staff appreciation week and coffee, staff shirts, building decals, student incentives, ACT/Pre-ACT testing snacks, student raffle, miscellaneous purchases. \$12,500 approved unanimously.
- Enrichment opportunities for students Booster started this conversation last year. Interest in focusing on students who don't have access to some of the things other students or schools have, such as camps, private lessons, special drama coaching, writing and STEM workshops, etc. Boosters would like to support bringing some of this training and coaching into the school to work with groups of students. Boosters Executive Team proposing we commit to \$20,000 in our budget for this year. \$20,000 approved unanimously.
- Senior signs + rally towels for pep rally Request from parent to purchase cardboard or glossy paper signs instead of plastic to be more environmentally friendly.
 \$3,200 — approved unanimously.
- Senior scholarships \$500 per student x 12 students for a total request of \$12,000 from Boosters. (Additional funds may be raised by families or others.) \$12,000 approved unanimously.
- Senior day + Homecoming decorations, coffee, lunch for volunteers at \$400 per each of these two events. \$800 — approved unanimously.
