Boosters news/discussion	<ul> <li>Concessions</li> <li>Concessions are beginning to wrap up for the fall sports season.</li> <li>Youth Football will be using the concessions space (with Booster Club supervision on site) with their own food</li> <li>Dual-Language Immersion program will be using the concessions space for Day of the Dead (again, with Booster Club supervision on site) with their own food</li> <li>Slated to host 3 Badger Development League tournaments, one each in December, January and February. Boosters will host concessions; huge fundraiser for us.</li> <li>We need more help in concessions! ## Other

- Laura Cornelius (MMSD nurse) will be taking over the clothing donations program with clothing from Monona Schools donated to schools on the east side. Clothing is cleaned for free by Klinke Cleaners and distributed.
- MSCR basketball club teams are interested in getting basketball jerseys. They would design their own shirts. We will ask MSCR coordinator (Dane) to submit a request for
